The Collect for Martyrs of New Guinea

Father, we thank thee for the martyrs of Papua New Guinea: they obeyed the call of thy Son Jesus Christ to take up their cross and follow Him, and so glorified thee by their deaths. Make thy Church strong by their witness and their prayers: may we follow their example of faithfulness and courage, work for thy kingdom and so be joined with thee for ever, through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with thee in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The Collect for Father's Day

O Holy Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named: We commend to thy gracious keeping all the fathers of our land; beseeching thee so to dwell in their hearts that they may know thee in daily life, and show forth to all men, the power and depth of thy grace; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Epistle

The Epistle is written in the eighth Chapter of Paul's Epistle to the Romans beginning at the thirty-third Verse.

Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth. Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter. Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors

through him that loved us. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Hear endeth the Epistle.

The Gospel

The Holy Gospel is written in the twelfth Chapter of John, beginning at the twentieth Verse.

Glory to thee Lord Christ.

And there were certain Greeks among them that came up to worship at the feast: The same came therefore to Philip, which was of Bethsaida of Galilee, and desired him, saying, Sir, we would see Jesus. Philip cometh and telleth Andrew: and again Andrew and Philip tell Jesus. And Jesus answered them, saying, The hour is come, that the Son of man should be glorified.

Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abideth alone: but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit. He that loveth his life shall lose it; and he that hateth his life in this world shall keep it unto life eternal. If any man serve me, let him follow me; and where I am, there shall also my servant be: if any man serve me, him will my Father honour. Now is my soul troubled; and what shall I say? Father, save me from this hour: but for this cause came I unto this hour. Father, glorify thy name. Then came there a voice from heaven, saying, I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again. The people therefore, that stood by, and heard it, said that it thundered: others said, An angel spake to him. Jesus answered and said, This voice came not because of me, but for your sakes. Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out. And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.

Praise to thee Lord Christ.

The Martyrs of New Guinea

During WWII 12 members of the staff of the Anglican Diocese of New Guinea lost their lives at the hands of the Japanese Army. The 9 missionaries among them had refused to leave the people to whom they ministered, and the 2 Papuans refused to abandon their missionary friends. 15 Lutheran, 24 Methodist, and 188 Roman Catholic missionaries and indigenous Church members also died for their faith in New Guinea, New Britain, and the Solomon Islands during WWII.
